## Pike Place Market Partners with Seattle Good Business Network to Host “Seattle Made Market Day”



**SEATTLE (September 25, 2017)** – [Seattle Good Business Network](#) and [Pike Place Market](#) will host “Seattle Made Market Day,” a shopping event celebrating local craftspeople and producers on Saturday, October 14, 2017.

As part of its third annual [Seattle Made Week](#), Market Day at Pike Place will feature 35 local producers set up in the MarketFront Pavilion, and will spotlight an additional 30 Seattle Made members who sell throughout Pike Place Market. This celebration of local artisan production and manufacturing will provide opportunities for attendees to meet, mingle and shop from these local producers who make their products within Seattle city limits.

“Local artisanal production is an integral part of Pike Place Market,” said David Dickinson, Daystall and Arts Program Manager at Pike Place Market. “We are very proud to host Seattle Made for this celebration of local makers.”

The event will include passport stations, encouraging attendees to explore the Market and locate the many Seattle Made members in the immediate vicinity. Attendees will be provided with punch cards and will have a chance to earn a participation prize and raffle tickets by visiting various stations. One point can be earned by showing event staff a selfie by the famous “Meet the Producer” sign at the iconic entrance to the Market at 1<sup>st</sup> Ave. and Pike Place.

“Seattle Made Week is a celebration of the many talented individuals who call Seattle home,” said Andrea Porter, Program Manager of Seattle Made. “Pike Place Market is the heart of the local maker scene and we’re grateful for their partnership for this event.”
