



Craft Vacation Daystall Short Sheets

CRAFT VACATION WEEKS:

- May be used for a week that a Regular Permit is absent from selling in the Market.
- May be used for a week that a Regular Permit sells just 1 day instead of 2.
- May be used on a week that a Regular Permit has an agent sell when the Permit Holder does not sell.
- May be used on a week that a permit holder does not employ an agent and sells just 1 weekday (instead of 2) to qualify to sell on Saturday.

CRAFT VACATION WEEK ALLOTMENTS:

- All Regular Permit holders receive 8 new vacation weeks on January 1 each year.
- All Regular Permit holders may roll over a max of 8 vacation weeks from the previous year.
- Regular Permit holders who have sold in the Market for 20 years receive an extra 1 vacation week at the start of the year (9 total).
- Regular Permit holders who have sold in the Market for 25 years receive an extra 1 vacation week at the start of the year (10 total).
- Regular Permit Holders may earn an extra vacation week if their business is in the Market for a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday block in the first three months of the calendar year (Jan., Feb., Mar.). They may do this up to 2 times for a total of 2 extra vacation weeks.
- Permit Holders who do 88+ permit holder attendance days in a year (above & beyond minimum requirements) will receive an extra 2 vacation weeks the next year.

ONE DAY WEEKS

- The Daystall Rules identify 6 weeks of the year as “One-Day Weeks.” They are: Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year’s Day.
- On a one-day week:
 - Regular Permits may sell a minimum of 1 day instead of 2.
 - Regular and Off Season Permits may sell 1 weekday (instead of 2), Monday-Friday, in order to qualify for selling on the following Saturday.
 - The Permit Holder is still required to sell 1 day on a one-day week.
